The South Lincoln County Historical Society has been hosting several great programs. Recently member Alan Harwood gave a talk about the Fossil shortline railroad depot near Kemmerer, which is currently being renovated. Carol Harwood gave an update on the 100th anniversary of the Frontier #1 mine explosion that occurred on August 14, 1923, killing 99 miners. The chapter is working to install a sign near Kemmerer commemorating this disaster. On a sad note the chapter reported the loss of Donna Oden and said, "She and **Dennis** were the foundation of our chapter. Their enthusiasm and efforts have resulted in a participation, enjoyment and love of our local history by the community."

Throughout the years more people have stepped in to fill their shoes and work hard to make sure that the Society's vision continues. The Wyoming Historical Foundation was formed in 1963 as the fundraising arm of the Society and through a variety of special projects over the years has been very successful in establishing a long-term endowment administered by the Wyoming Community Foundation. Sandy said that the changes are primarily housekeeping, i.e. changing references to Executive Secretary to Executive Director; removing the word "Constitution" throughout; and punctuation, all of which will improve readability.

The Bylaws are important to the Society and Chapters, and provide guidance as to how all entities should perform. Updates are generally made on an annual basis, and always require a majority vote to amend.

Donna Oden of Kemmerer died on July 1, 2023. Donna, along with her husband, Dennis were instrumental in keeping the South Lincoln County Historical Society active. Her contributions will long be remembered. We extend our sympathies to Dennis, their children and grandchildren, and to members of the chapter.

Long time member **Jacqueline Dagenais** of Sarasota, Florida died in February, 2023. Her husband said that she valued her membership in the Society, and over the past decades had become increasingly interested in learning more about the rich history her family in Nebraska, South Dakota and Wyoming.
