

#### **VOTE NOW FOR YOUR FAVORITE 2016 ARTIFACT**

The Wyoming State Historical Society, in partnership with the University of Wyoming Libraries, invites everyone to participate in selecting "Wyoming's Top Ten Most Significant Artifacts" for 2016. Submissions received from libraries, museums, historical societies and other institutions, were reviewed by a panel of independent judges to determine the top twenty-five. The public now has the opportunity to vote on the top ten. Voting ends on July 15<sup>th</sup>.

Society president, Tamsen Hert, noted that the program was created last year in celebration of the state's 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary. "It was so popular among everyone, including students, that it was agreed to continue the program." She added, "This year we received more than forty submissions, each one representing an important aspect of Wyoming's history." Tamsen added that this program draws attention to the state's cultural heritage and also to the institutions that bring that heritage to the public's attention. We also hope that educators around the state will encourage students to vote.

Top Ten voting begins immediately, with winners being announced in September at the Society's annual meeting. Voting ends on July 15<sup>th</sup> so vote NOW! All ages are encouraged to vote. Votes must be submitted electronically by going to the Society's website and clicking on the link "What's New," and then following the tab for 2016 voting. The link is:

## **Wyoming Archipedia Now Online**

WSHS member, Mary Humstone, a 2015 recipient of Homsher Research Grant funds writes that The first 50 entries of Wyoming Archipedia are now online (<a href="http://sah-archipedia.org">http://sah-archipedia.org</a>). SAH Archipedia Wyoming is part of SAH Archipedia, an interactive, media-rich, online encyclopedia of the built environment in the United States. As coordinator of the Wyoming project, Mary is responsible for developing the list of 100 properties to feature on the website, and for writing and/or supervising the writing of each building's entries. For each entry Mary researched the history of the building, using National Register nominations, articles, books, and other sources. She then wrote a description of the building, highlighting its salient architectural features, history and significance into an essay. She said, "The Homsher Research Grant provided critical funding for my travel throughout Wyoming." Mary traveled approximately 3,000 miles throughout the state to visit and photograph buildings.

Mary said, "Thank you to the Wyoming State Historical Society (Lola Homsher grant for research

travel) and the dedicated writers who contributed to these entries." The writers include WSHS members Brie Blasi, Lesley Wischmann, Ruth Lauritzen, Arlene Ekland-Ernst, and Barbara Bogart. Other writers were Tony Denzer, Lesley Gilmore, Morgan Albertson, Paula Taylor and Fred Chapman.

Mary added, "Thanks to Richard Collier for his beautiful photographs. Thanks for overall guidance and early research on this project to the Preservation Dream Team (Sheila Bricher-Wade, Rheba Massey and BA Beierle). 



**Sylvia Bruner**, chair of the Society's Homsher Committee, announces that our of ten applications, four have been awarded for a total o\$5,000.00. They are:


